The most important things in this world are not things.

On March 12 at 4:46pm, the perception of safety in our neighborhood was shattered and longtime Butchers Hill residents, the Smallwood family, suffered an indelible and tragic loss when thirty-three-year-old Nasir was shot and killed.

To the Smallwood family, please know

that your loss is our loss. You have our sincerest condolences and all of our collective empathy. Your community is and will be here for you.

To our community, thank you for joining together to support our neighbors with love and compassion during this unimaginable time. We are each other's angels.

As the events of March 12 are part of an active police investigation, at the time of this writing, official information provided to our community has been sparse. Detectives have been thorough in collecting information from both private and community resources. It is our understanding that people heard yelling prior to the shooting.

While we can't change the past and undo this tragedy, we can work together, as a community, to make the future safer. It is our collective responsibility to make every effort to ensure no family experiences a similar loss in Butchers Hill and beyond. To that end, I reached out to Captain DellaRocco asking for specific clarification on calling 911 if a verbal altercation is witnessed. "If a verbal altercation is witnessed and appears serious in nature, please contact 911 for Officers to investigate."

The adage "if you see something, say something" holds; should you witness an escalating argument or something as our former Captain, now Major Danita Boyd phrased it "feels wrong or dangerous" do not hesitate to call 911. Provide BPD the opportunity to assess the situation. You may save a life.

Given past incidents of police misconduct directed at people of color throughout the country, and in our city in particular, I understand people may feel uncomfortable about calling 911. That is why the US Department of Justice implemented the consent decree in 2017. Major Colòn and Captain DellaRocco are consummate professionals who hold those under their command to high standards. They are serious about ensuring their officers are here to serve and protect the community without violating the rights or dignity of individuals. If you witness something to the contrary, let them know. If you have a positive experience with an officer, they want to know that as well.

Our Safety Committee has compiled an extensive list of "tips and tricks" in an effort to further empower us as individuals. The list is available at *butchershill.org/safety*. The Committee meets via Zoom on the second Wednesday of each month. This meeting is open to any Butchers Hill resident. In addition, the Safety Committee and Streetscape Committee now conduct joint Community Appreciation Walks on the third Wednesday of the month. SED officers, SED command, DPW, representatives from our city council rep's offices, and the States Attorney's office may join us on any given walk. All residents are invited to join us. Please check the calendar and newsletter for the starting point and route.

In 2023 the BHA was awarded a security grant by the State of Maryland. To date we have deployed three sophisticated high-resolution camera systems at key strategic points in our neighborhood. We anticipate a follow-on grant cycle opening soon, and we will request additional funds for more cameras, lights as well as traffic calming and pedestrian safety measures. Besides being known as "Baltimore's friendliest neighborhood," we want criminals to know us as the neighborhood where if you perpetrate a crime, you are on camera and will be caught. Please know that the BHA does not have access to the cameras and the cameras are not monitored in real time. The recordings are used retrospectively by the police when investigating crimes or traffic incidents.

The easiest and most rewarding action we can each take to make our community safer is to get to know our neighbors. Look out for each other. Take in each other's packages. Invite them over to your stoop for a cold drink on a warm afternoon. Maybe even walk over St Andrew together on the first Wednesday of the month for our community meeting. I'll be looking for you.

Stay safe and most of all, thank you for being the most caring, welcoming neighborhood in which I have ever lived.

Safety Committee

Water Service Line Survey \\ The Safety Committee reminds everyone to take DPW's self-reporting service line survey. This short survey is designed to quickly discover and report the material of the water service line entering your home. The survey is part of a nationwide effort to find and address lead pipes. 911 Reporting \\ Use the 911 service to report traffic accidents, events that make you feel unsafe, and loud disturbances where people appear to be fighting in the street. Recent events have shown the importance of giving our first responders early notice of developing situations. There is no stigma to calling 911. Furthermore, city agencies use 911 calling patterns to make resource decisions and to focus on trouble spots.

Community Appreciation Walk \\ The combined Safety and Streetscape Committees' Community Appreciation (CA) Walks began on a cold, windy night in March. It was a good time, all the same, investigating traffic and parking issues, checking out the trees in bloom, assessing lighting in Castle Street Park, picking up blowing litter, meeting new folks, and splashing down at La Barrita. The next CA Walk will happen Wed., Apr. 17, at 7pm starting in Halcott Square. Everyone is invited to this mobile stoop sit; bring your kids and pets and enjoy a stroll in the company of your neighbors.
