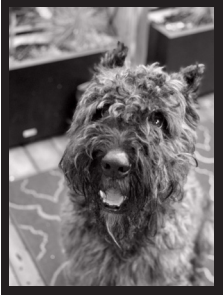

Only YOU Can Prevent Sewer Backups \\\ Up-hillers can help prevent floods “downstream” in harbor-front areas by taking care with what gets into their sewer system. Two preventable clogs are leaves and FOG. Leaves are easy—put them in the trash. FOG stands for fats, oils, and grease which, when allowed to go into the drains, congeals with other items (leaves, etc.) to cause an ever-increasing clog. Fats, oils, and grease need to be drained into containers (like metal cans) or wiped up with paper towels and then put into the regular trash. Problem solved!

Tree Care \\\ February is the ideal time to prune trees, bushes, and shrubs. If the end of a branch snaps when bent, it is dead. Follow the branch back to where it is attached to a trunk or comes out of the ground and cut it off parallel to the surface it is coming from so that only a small amount protrudes. That small amount will heal the wound. Remember, in Baltimore City, only certified TreeKeepers can prune city trees alongside sidewalks and in public spaces like parks.

Winter Reminders

Snow Removal Reminder \ Occupants must remove snow from the public footpath within three hours after snow has stopped falling or by 11am.

Dangerous Snow Melt Products \ Please consider using a product that is safe for pets and vegetation. Dogs and cats lick their paws to clean them, particularly between toes. Help them by having a container of warm, clean water you can dip each paw in as soon as you get home. Or use a damp cloth to get any snow or ice out from between those toes.

Code Blue \ Through March 15, the Health Department will declare code blue extreme cold alerts if the temperature (with wind chill) goes below 14 degrees. Please check on those in need, the elderly, and pets living outside. Temperatures below 10 degrees require pets be brought into a heated enclosure.
