BGE Regulator Installations \\ At the recent BHA general meeting, we had a lively discussion about the work BGE is doing in nearby neighborhoods installing gas regulators. There is a petition started to ask our elected leaders and the Maryland Public Service Commission to take action by assisting Baltimore communities in pausing the installation of outside gas regulators in Baltimore City and coming up with a real solution that takes into account our high density and historic neighborhoods. BGE has temporarily paused the installations, but is planning to start again.

My Solar Power Experience by Greg Morris

I recently did research to install solar power on my roof and thought I would share some of what I found:

Houses that have roofs with minimal shading by trees and adjacent structures, in addition to roofs that allow facing of panels in a southern and/or western direction, are better candidates for solar panels. Aerial photographs and satellite images assist in the evaluation of the capability of one's roof for solar panels and will also be incorporated into the proposed designs.

Flat roofs do present a special challenge to many solar panel installers. I went with a company that was willing to find a non-penetrating solution that also took into account how much weight my roof can support. Solar Stack has an adhesive, non-roof-penetrating solar panel mounting system (<u>solarstack.com</u>). IronRidge has railing options for flat roofs that can anchor along the house's wall for better support and improved weight distribution (<u>ironridge.com/flat-roofs</u>).
