Volunteer: we need people for two-hour shifts throughout the day of the flea market. Go to butchershill.org/2024-spring-flea-market and click on the Volunteer link to sign up.

Donate your gently used items (if it isn't nice enough to give to a friend, please don't donate it) to the BHA table. Proceeds go to support two of our local preK-8 schools. Drop off your donations from 7-10am at the Lombard St. entrance to Patterson Park. Tax receipts available upon request. We can't accept the following items: large appliances, tube TVs and monitors, furniture (if you can't pick it up with one hand, we can't take it), and beds and bedding.

One more way that everyone can participate in the flea market is to come shop! There will be live music, food, and lots of fun. Hope to see everyone in the park on May 11!

Cumbersome Can Control

It's spring, and our neighborhood is looking wonderfully green and colorful with the trees full of leaves and the pots filled with blossoms. Remember that trashcans can't be stored in front of our houses. It can be difficult to move and store those large, city-issued cans since trashcans can't be stored in the front and are a hassle to move in and out, and up and down stairs. Here's an option to consider: you aren't required to use the city-issued cans, as long as you do use a rat-proof can with a tight-fitting lid. If you don't want your green can, note the number on the can and contact 311 by phone or on the baltimorecity.gov website to have the city pick it up. Buy the size of can that fits your needs. Hopefully this idea may make it easier to keep Butchers Hill a beautiful place where everyone is proud to live!

Safety Committee

Community Appreciation Walk \ Wed., May 15, 7pm, starting at Halcott Square on South Duncan St. These mobile stop and chats are a great way to get out and explore the spring vegetation, architecture, and the people of Butchers Hill. The weather should be warm, and the walk will end around sunset. Those interested can continue on with us to a local watering hole.

Grant Proposal \\ the Safety Committee worked with the Streetscapes Committee in April to write proposals toward the 2024 Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development grants towards cameras, lighting, and related safety services, and environmental health and justice. We hope we are awarded again in 2024 to continue the work we have been doing as a community to improve lighting, reduce urban heat island effects, bring traffic calming, and to add video cameras to dangerous intersections.

Survey Reminder \\ If you haven't already done so, take a few minutes to complete DPW's self-reporting service line survey. This short survey is designed to quickly discover and report the material of the water service line entering your home. The survey is part of a nationwide effort to find and address lead pipes. DPW has mailed survey instructions to us all that explain the simple process. If you need help completing the survey, contact the Safety Committee (See page 4) and we can arrange to have a DPW representative stop by to help you with it.
