NOTE FROM THE TREASURER

Just a reminder that everyone's dues are "due" for 2017. Unless you have paid for multiple years in advance, all memberships start over each January. Dues are \$10 per person, \$6 for seniors.

The money collected from dues is combined with the funds that we raise at our fundraisers: the flea markets, house tour, and garden tour. We then make expenditures based on our annual budget, which is voted on by the general membership early each year. TIMELY ADVICE FOR SAFETY

- Watch out for neighbors' property, and be alert to mail or package theft.
- Avoid carrying a purse.
- Do not use your cell phone while walking.
- Turn on outside lights every night, or save time and money by adding a dusk-to-dawn sensor in your outside light, with an LED bulb. We will all be safer and cameras will get better lighting.
- Call 911 for any crime or suspicious activity.

Remember, officers are deployed based on recently reported criminal activity.
