Hello Everyone!

As you may recall, last year we applied to have Baltimore Green Spaces acquire Halcott Square/ Duncan Street Park for the benefit of Butchers Hill in order to prevent it from being sold by the City in an asset sale. Since then, there has been significant progress in this area. After conducting due-diligence on the park, Baltimore Green Spaces voted to approve the acquisition. Baltimore Green Spaces then applied to acquire Halcott Square from the Baltimore City Planning Department. The Planning Department approved the application and then forwarded it on to the City's Department of Housing and Community Development. Housing and Community Development needs to process some paperwork to "make the whole thing happen," but the process is well on its way.

At our August meeting, we will be getting "back to business," recruiting volunteers for the House Tour and the September Flea Market. These are wonderful events, but they don't happen without our volunteers. We have invited Gregg Bernstein, City State's Attorney, as a special guest to speak about public safety concerns. I look forward to seeing you at the July picnic!

Summertime Curfew for Youngsters Under 17

Children must be accompanied by an adult in public spaces Sundays through Thursdays, 11 p.m. - 6 a.m. and Fridays and Saturdays, midnight - 3 a.m. City leaders have opened up a curfew center where children under the age of 17 will be taken if they are found in public places or certain establishments without adult supervision after curfew on Saturdays or Sundays.
