STORMWATER RETENTION BUMPOUTS GET SPRING CLEANING

BHA and Commodore John Rogers seventh grade volunteers weeded unwanted non-native plants, removed trash, and planted new native perennials in the bumpouts at Fairmount & Chester and Lombard & Chester streets. BlueWater Baltimore supplied tools. plant material and plant identification expertise. The third bumpout, at Baltimore & Collington streets, is awaiting action from the city. These bumpouts are designed to filter stormwater runoff before it flows via the sewer system into Baltimore Harbor and the Chesapeake Bay. Although many of these native plants may not look familiar, each has been selected for its ability to stabilize the soil, absorb water, and/or provide food or shelter for native insects and birds. As the plants mature and fill in, each bumpout will become more effective at the jobs it was designed to do. Your patience and assistance in keeping trash and pets out of these green spaces is very much appreciated.

AUDUBON'S GREEN LEADERS' BILINGUAL VIDEO RELEASE

Patterson Park Audubon Center's Green Leaders had an action-packed first year! This spring, Audubon visited BHA to share how we can create resilient communities for our birds and people by saving energy at home and at work, advocating for a healthy climate, and planting wildlife gardens. Audubon's Green Leaders program for middle school students cultivates initiative in climate change communication. Green Leaders interviewed and filmed each other to create a video, in partnership with New Lens, a youth-driven social justice organization. This capstone project illustrates what the students learned through trust-building activities, community presentations, bird watching, and planting wildlife gardens. Thanks to partners, Hampstead Hill Academy and Chesapeake Bay Trust, Green Leaders created a video to inspire their neighbors and classmates to take climate action. Pool admission fees for the 2016 swim season are \$2 per two-hour session, \$4 for Early Bird Lap Swim, or Summer Season Passes \$30 (\$50 to include early am lap swim).
