Patterson Park Pool Hours:

Early birds note: Lap Swim must pay for the cost of early opening or will be discontinued. It is currently scheduled for 6-10am, Mon.-Fri., \$50 per season, which includes all other times the pool is open, except Sun., noon-1pm Zumba classes.

Weekends from 10-noon, are reserved for Baby Country Club, \$55 per child for ten weeks (July 1-Sept.2). Registration is required. Children 3 and under must wear swim diapers. All remaining times are designated as Family Swim and cost \$2 per person per session, or \$30 per season. Children 17 years old and under must be accompanied and supervised by an adult (21+) at all times. Proper swimwear must be worn at all times, regardless if you are swimming or not.

Family Swim sessions are Mon.-Fri., Session 1: noon-3:30pm, break for health inspection, Session 2: 4-7pm; Sat., Session 1: noon-3pm, break for health inspection, Session 2: 3:30-6:30pm; and Sun. Session 1: 1-3pm, break for health inspection, Session 2: 3:30-6pm. Each time the pool is inspected a new session begins. There are two different Family Swim sessions per day. A season is the whole summer. Lockers are limited and require quarters to operate: small \$1, large \$1.50. The pool does not offer change. In Patterson Park, 148 S. Linwood Ave., 410-396-8975.
